

Submission to the Commerce Commission on its Draft Report - Residential building supplies market study

We therefore wish to emphasise **our support for**:

- The creation of efficient processes and pathways for products to become accepted for use, including certification, Acceptable Solutions, Verification Methods, standards and CodeMark rules as outlined in the report's recommendations.
- Exploring ways to remove impediments to product substitution and the need for consent variations for minor changes to building design that do not place responsibility and liability on BCAs.

- The development of a National Product Register BCAs are not product certifiers.
- MBIE playing a greater role in education and the dissemination of information to the industry and BCAs.

We consider these enhancements would improve the overall efficiency and effectiveness of the building system and would meet the Commission's own competition goals.
