## Official Information Act #19.008 - Wilson Parking

- 1. We refer to your request received 8 July 2019 where you asked whether the Commerce Commission (the Commission) is concerned about Wilson Parking almost fully controlling monthly parking options across Wellington.
- 2. We have treated this as a request for information under the Official Information Act 1982 (OIA).

## Our response

- 3. We have decided to decline your request because you have asked for our opinion rather than for information we hold. The Commission is not required to form an opinion in order to answer a request.<sup>1</sup>
- 4. However, in July 2018 the Commission filed proceedings against Wilson Parking NZ Limited. The Commission alleges that when Wilson Parking acquired the lease to operate the Capital Car Park in Boulcott Street, Wellington, it breached section 47 of the Commerce Act 1986 because the acquisition resulted in a substantial lessening of competition. The case is to be heard in the Wellington High Court in December 2019.
- 5.
