4.1 New Zealand CCH

Once you have submitted this completed form to the Commission, then you will be emailed a link to access the Ministry of Justice (MOJ) online portal to complete the form for your CCH.

The Commission must receive a New Zealand CCH for all directors and senior managers even if they have never resided in New Zealand.

Your CCH will be sent directly to the Commission from the MOJ after you complete your CCH form through the online portal. Once the Commission has received your CCH from MOJ we will proceed with the assessment of your application.

4.2 Australian Police Report

If you have resided in Australia for 12 months or more within the last 10 years (note that the 12 months do not need to be consecutive), then you will need to attach an Australian police report of your criminal and infringement history (including transport offences).

Please note:

- The report must be issued from the relevant State law enforcement agency.
- Documents must be less than 3 months old.

4.3 International Police Report

If you have resided in a country outside New Zealand or Australia for 12 months or more within the last ten years (note that the 12 months do not need to be consecutive), then you will need to supply a police report of your criminal and infringement history (including transport offences), relating to that specific country, if you have been convicted of a crime punishable by imprisonment in that country (even if you did not receive a sentence of imprisonment).

Please note:

- The report must be issued from the relevant local law enforcement agency.
- Documents must be less than 3 months old.
- All documents not in English must be translated.
- Original documents must be sent in with the English translation.
- The Commission reserves the right to request further information from you at any stage to assist it in determining your application.

5. PROVIDING A COPY OF YOUR ID

Please provide a copy of your ID with this application so we can check that the right person has filled in the required forms. Your ID must:

- be a clear and readable copy
- exactly match the details in your form write your name on the form exactly as it is on your ID
- not be defaced.

You must use one of the following:

- Your New Zealand driver licence. This can be current or expired within the last 2 years, but must not be cancelled or a temporary licence.
- Your New Zealand passport. This must be signed and can be current or expired within the last 2 years, but must not be cancelled.
- Your overseas passport. This must be signed and current.
- Your New Zealand firearms licence. This must be current.

If you don't have any of these, you will need to complete a Proof of Identity form and Statutory Declaration form, which can be downloaded from the Ministry of Justice Website.

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6. CONSENT TO DISCLOSE INFORMATION

In signing this declaration, you authorise the Commission to conduct enquiries and collect personal information about you from any third party, including any person and any New Zealand or overseas government agency, regulatory body or professional body – for the purpose of determining whether you are a fit and proper person to hold your position. This includes carrying out good character, qualification and criminal history checks.

For that purpose, I authorise:

- The Commission to disclose my personal information to any third party for the purpose of determining whether I am a fit and proper person to hold my position.
- Any third party to disclose my personal information to the Commission for the purpose of determining whether I am a fit and proper person to hold my position.

IMPORTANT: The CCCF Act provides it is an offence for any person to make (or authorise the making of) a statement that they know is false or misleading in a material particular. If convicted, the penalty is a fine up to \$200,000 (for an individual) or \$600,000 (for a body corporate).

Knowingly providing false or misleading information in this form may also lead to certification being suspended or cancelled.

8. PRIVACY

We collect the information you provide in this form to enable the Commission to undertake our functions under the CCCF Act including considering this application for certification under Part 5A of the Act.

The Commission must be satisfied you are a fit and proper person to hold the position of director or senior manager before we can issue a certification. Providing the information in this form is voluntary but if you do not provide all or part of the information, the Commission may not be able to process this application for certification.

We collect, manage and dispose of your personal information consistent with our obligations under the Privacy Act 2020, Official Information Act 1982 and Public Records Act 2005. We will not use your personal information for any other purpose than for which it was obtained, unless it is:

- a. publicly available (and it would not be unfair or unreasonable to use the information);
- b. authorised by you;
- c. connected with or directly related to the purpose for which it was obtained;
- d. used in a form in which you are not identifiable, or for statistical or research purposes and will not be published in a form which could reasonably identify you;
- e. necessary to avoid prejudice to the maintenance of the law by any public sector agency, including the prevention, detection, investigation, prosecution or punishment of offences, or for the enforcement of a law imposing a pecuniary penalty;
- f. necessary for the protection of the public revenue;
- g. necessary for the conduct of proceedings before any court or tribunal (proceedings that have commenced or are reasonably in contemplation);
- necessary to prevent or lessen a serious threat to public health or safety, or the life or health of any individual; or
- i. authorised by the Privacy Commissioner.
