1 The Mobile Co-location Service

- 1.1 References to clauses or sections are references to clauses or sections in this Co-location on Cellular Mobile Transmission Sites Service Description (**Mobile Co-location Service Description**) unless expressly provided otherwise. Defined terms are denoted by the use of capital letters. The definitions set out in this Mobile Co-location Service Description apply to the extent that they are not expressly modified by or inconsistent with the definitions set out in the Mobile Co-location General Terms or the Mobile Co-location Operations Manual.
- 1.2 The Mobile Co-location Service is a service that enables co-location of Cellular Mobile Telephone Network transmission and reception equipment (including any necessary supporting equipment) on or with the Relevant Facilities.
- 1.3 Illustrative diagrams of the Mobile Co-location Service are attached as Appendix A.

2 Relevant Facilities

- 2.1 The Mobile Co-location Service includes access to and the use of, space in, on, or with the Relevant Facilities for the purposes of installing and maintaining Access Seeker Equipment.
- 2.2 The Relevant Facilities available for co-location are:
 - 2.2.1 any Mast; and
 - 2.2.2 any Site, Building or Utility Service.
- 2.3 The Mobile Co-location Service includes the provision of access to Utility Services. The Utility Services may include, but are not limited to:
 - 2.3.1 lighting;
 - 2.3.2 air-conditioning;
 - 2.3.3 power, including AC main power feed and transformer;
 - 2.3.4 access track;
 - 2.3.5 fencing, including security fence and gate;
 - 2.3.6 maintenance; and
 - 2.3.7 electrical and lightning earthing.
- 2.4 For the avoidance of doubt, power referred to in clause 2.3.3 excludes emergency back-up power.

3 Mobile Co-location Service Assistance

- 3.1 The Access Provider is to provide assistance to enable the provision of the Mobile Co-location Service as follows, in each case to be provided in accordance with the Mobile Co-location Operations Manual:
 - 3.1.1 to enable access by the Access Seeker to a Common Format Database to include the Standard Site Types;

- 3.1.2 to provide a Provisioning System to enable the Access Seeker to make Applications in relation to the Mobile Co-location Service;
- 3.1.3 to provide a Site Data Pack in response to a Site Data Pack Application in order to assist the Access Seeker to assess the suitability of a Relevant Facility for the Mobile Colocation Service:
- 3.1.4 to participate in a Detailed Site Design Visit in order to provide the Access Seeker with additional information in advance of providing a Full Site Application, if required;
- 3.1.5 to assess a Full Site Application and, if approved, to issue the Preliminary Site Approval;
- 3.1.6 to provide the Access Seeker with reasonable assistance if reasonably requested by the Access Seeker for the purpose of fulfilling the conditions in the Preliminary Site Approval;
- 3.1.7 to assess the Access Seeker's Preliminary Notice and, if approved, to issue the Final Site Approval;
- 3.1.8 to assess the Project Plan submitted by the Access Seeker and, if approved, to issue the Approval to Build; and
- 3.1.9 to assess a Multi-Site Application submitted by the Access Seeker and, if approved, to prepare a Multi-Site Project Plan.

4 Mobile Co-location Service Exclusions

- 4.1 The Mobile Co-location Service specifically excludes, without limitation:
 - 4.1.1 housing of Access Seeker Equipment (including any necessary supporting equipment) that is not approved by the Access Provider in accordance with the Mobile Co-location Operations Manual, the Mobile Co-location General Terms, and the Mobile Co-location Access Terms:
 - 4.1.2 co-location in relation to the unbundled copper local loop (**UCLL**) service;
 - 4.1.3 backhaul service;
 - 4.1.4 access to any part of the Access Provider's network that is not a Relevant Facility;
 - 4.1.5 housing of Access Seeker Equipment that is not used to support a Cellular Mobile Telephone Network; and
 - 4.1.6 housing of Access Seeker Equipment in, on or with a Site or Building where the Access Seeker does not have, or is not in the process of applying for location of, Antenna on the Mast(s) associated with that Site or Building.

5 Service Levels

5.1 The applicable service levels are set out in the Mobile Co-location Service Level Terms.




Illustrative diagrams of the Mobile Co-location Service¹
